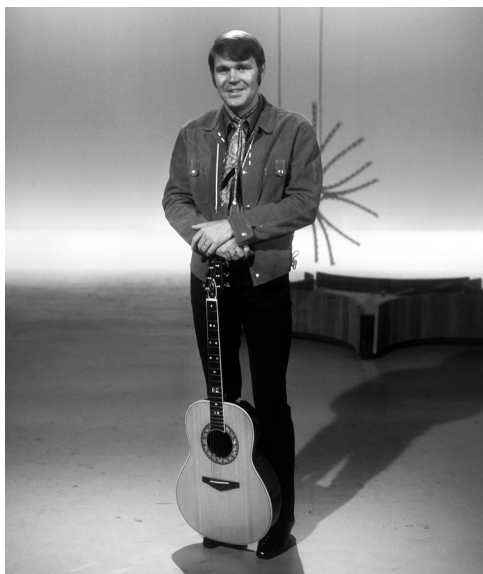

Step back in time and journey through the compelling history of a truly American art form when **Country Music**, a new eight-part, 16-hour film directed by Ken Burns, and produced by Burns and his long-time collaborators Dayton Duncan and Julie Dunfey. The film premieres at 7 pm Sunday, September 15 and runs through Wednesday, September 18, as well as Sunday, September 22 through Wednesday, September 25.



The documentary, written by Duncan, who also wrote the illustrated companion book (coming from Alfred A. Knopf on September 10), chronicles the highs and lows of country music's early days—from southern Appalachia's songs of struggle, heartbreak, and faith to the rollicking Western swing of Texas, California's honky-tonks, and Nashville's "Grand Ole Opry." The film follows the evolution of country music over the course of the 20th century as it eventually emerges to become "America's music."

Country Music explores the crucial questions "What is country music?" and "Where did it come from?" while focusing on the biographies of the fascinating trailblazers who created and shaped it—from the Carter Family, Jimmie Rodgers, Bill Monroe, and Bob Wills to Hank Williams, Patsy Cline, Johnny Cash, Merle Haggard, Loretta Lynn, Charley Pride, Willie Nelson, Dolly Parton, Emmylou Harris, Garth Brooks, and many more—as well as the times in which they lived. Much like the music itself, the film tells unforgettable stories of hardships and joys shared by everyday people.

EPISODE 2: HARD TIMES

Watch as Nashville becomes the heart of the country music industry. The genre grows in popularity during the Great Depression and World War II as America falls in love with singing cowboys and Minnie Pearl (*above*).

EPISODE 3: THE HILLBILLY SHAKESPEARE

See how the bluegrass sound spreads in post-war America, and meet honky-tonk star Hank Williams (*right*), whose songs of surprising emotional depth are derived from his troubled and tragically short life.



EPISODE 4: I CAN'T STOP LOVING YOU

Travel to Memphis, where Sun Studios artists Johnny Cash and Elvis Presley (*left*) usher in the era of rockabilly. Ray Charles crosses America’s racial divide by recording a country album.

Learn how “New Traditionalists” like George Strait, Randy Travis and the Judds (*left*) help country music stay true to its roots. Witness both the rise of superstar Garth Brooks and the return of an aging Johnny Cash to the industry he helped create.

"I was involved from the beginning when we met with Don Mullally, Ruth Youngerman, Mike Mottler, and a few others. The interest in starting a Friends of WILL was initiated from a study group of AAUW (American Association of University Women) called 'Media Issues in Communications.' I asked Don Mullally to speak at one of our meetings. He mentioned the tight University budget and plans to cut support; that without private support we may no longer have public radio. I just couldn't let that happen, so I started recruiting members of AAUW, and they in turn got many of their friends involved in volunteering.

At the beginning, the volunteers helped with **Classics by Request**, and getting *Patterns* addressed and sent out and the pledge drives, just to name a few of the things that volunteers did to help the station.

In 1991 at the 50th anniversary of WILL-FM, a four-page history was printed and my involvement was recognized. I am so pleased that the Friends has continued and has allowed all three stations to thrive, AM, FM and TV. "

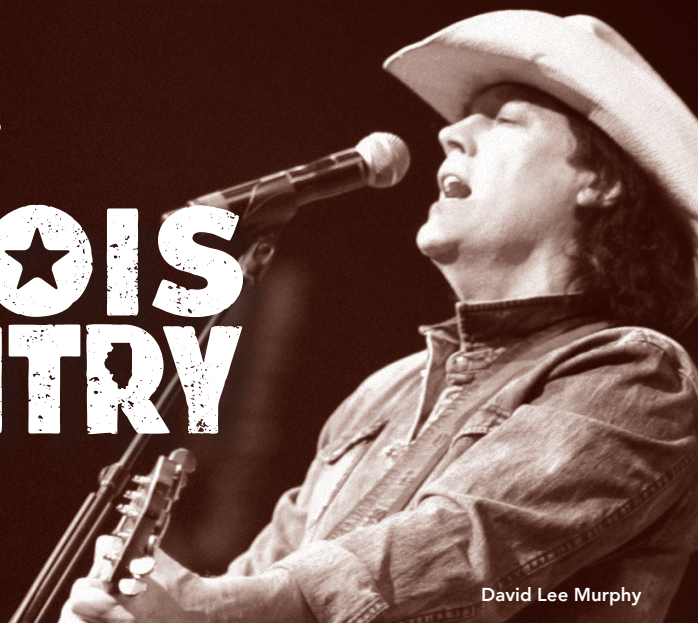

Illinois Radio Reader grant renewed as program expands to more listeners

Now in its 40th year, the Illinois Radio Reader is looking to reach more people with limited ability to read. The service is underwritten by WILL and the Illinois State Library through a grant that was recently renewed.

As the Baby Boomers age, it is predicted there will be over three million senior citizens who will lose all or partial ability to read on their own. For older adults, the ability to negotiate the world without sight is difficult. Being able to listen to broadcasts of the local newspaper, current magazines, and books keeps the listeners in sync with the world around them.

Illinois Radio Reader provides that sound connection for anyone who cannot read on their own, for any reason, as we know staying in touch with the community is important. Over 50 volunteers record material every week for the listener by either coming to the studio at WILL or by reading at home. This loyal bunch of readers even record on holidays so that the listeners are kept current.

Most of you know someone who would benefit from the Illinois Radio Reader service. At no cost to the client, a receiver can be provided with a short application. The live stream on the website is available 24 hours a day and there is a list of prior readings that can be listened to at any time.
