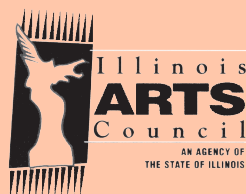

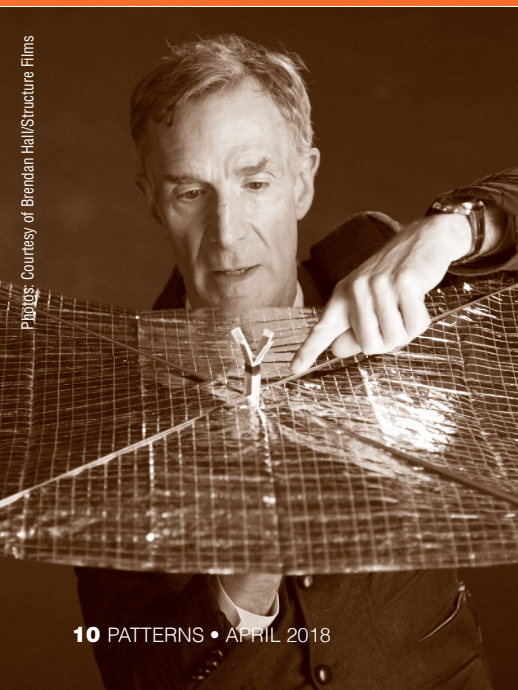

The new **POV** film **Bill Nye: Science Guy** focuses on Nye's mission to stop the spread of anti-scientific thought and action. Once the host of a popular kids' show and now the CEO of the Planetary Society, he's leading a mission to launch LightSail, a satellite propelled by sunlight, while in turn fulfilling the legacy of his late professor and Planetary Society cofounder Carl Sagan.

In addition to taking off his signature "Science Guy" lab coat, Nye has started taking on those who deny the importance of science. Nye goes head-to-head to advocate for the scientific community and its invaluable findings.

And Nye acknowledges that he's ready for a new challenge. "The Science Guy show is over, and I've got to move on to something bigger," he says. "We have this increasing anti-science movement in the United States. It's worse than ever. The anti-science movement is more powerful than it's ever been."

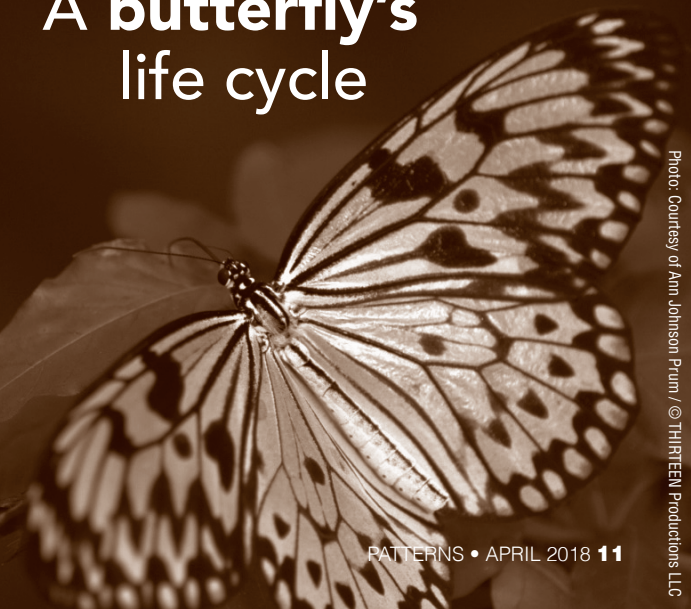
Masterpiece brings anew mystery

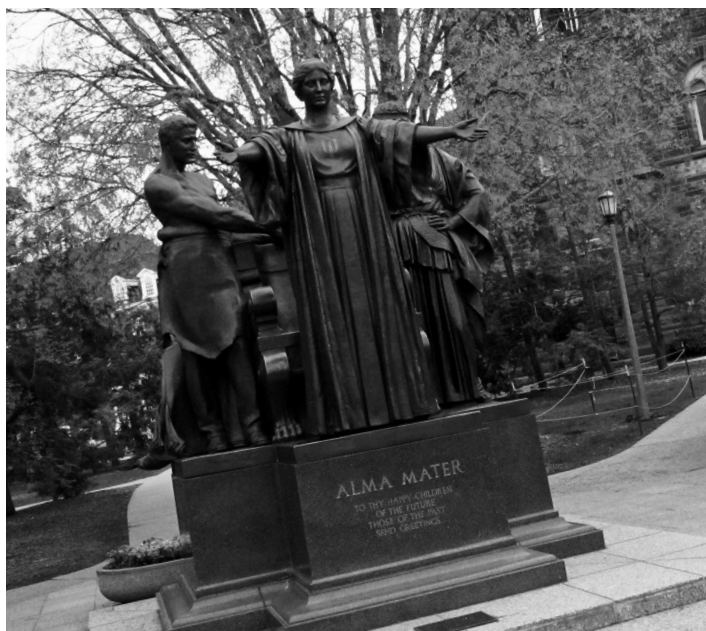
