Filmmaker returns home to explore past

What do you do when burying the past isn't easy anymore?

After 44 years of virtual silence, film director Paul Sheriff returns to the heartland of America and confronts his childhood in this compelling and inspirational documentary.

My Sister Hali, airing at 7 pm Tuesday, June 5, is a historical chronicle of the Blue Mound Gymnastics Club formed in the early 1960s in Blue Mound, Illinois. The backbone of the film is the exceptional gymnastic career of a physical genius named Hali, and the dynamic driving force of her mother and gymnastics coach, Ginny Sheriff. At the age of 14, before Hali could be recognized as one of the best female gymnasts in the world, her life was cut short. While returning from a gymnastics exhibition in Cedar Rapids, Iowa in 1966, Hali and Ginny were killed in a tragic plane crash. Also killed was Hali's father, the Reverend Harold Sheriff, who was piloting the plane, as well as family friends, Nancy

Beckett, Billy Beckett, and Nancy Beckett's niece, Joanna Wulfsberg. At the time, Hali's brother Paul Sheriff. the director of **My Sister Hali**, was just ten years old.

Juxtaposed with this story is a secondary theme that addresses how the director perceived his past over the last 45 years. Through video diary, archival footage, and location interviews, the film explores the effects and influences of this traumatic event in Sheriff's life and the lives of the immediate surviving members of his family, teammates, and friends. Within this framework, the film critically examines loss and the changing roles and relationships within the family unit. **My Sister Hali** also addresses athletic competition as a philosophy of life, with its effects on the individual athlete.

Interviews are juxtaposed with vintage images, gathered historical text, and metaphorical images that conjure past emotions and allow the viewer to become a part of Paul's journey. The intent of the film is to find some commonality shared by us all when addressing the past and honoring its inescapable presence in our daily lives.

I am truly grateful for Dianne Noland who was instrumental in contacting WILL to air my documentary, **My Sister Hali**.

Hali began her amazing journey at the Palaestrum in Champaign-Urbana, under the supervision of legendary gymnastics coach Charlie Pond in the late 1950s.

Now, 60 years later, she again will capture our hearts as we share her incredible story.

IPM staff win multiple awards

The Illinois Associated Press honored Illinois Public Media with 3 awards. The ceremony was held in East Peoria on Saturday, April 21, as part of the Illinois News Broadcasters Association convention. Scott Cameron, executive editor of Illinois Newsroom, said, "IPM's journalists continue to raise the bar on community-focused journalism that offers depth, context and meaningful resources to the audiences we serve. These awards honor the creativity, commitment and passion of our news team."



Christine Herman won second place in the Hard News Feature category for her story "Medicaid Bill Backlog Pushing Illinois Doctors to The Brink of Closure." Herman, a reporter for Illinois Public Media, investigated the story after learning that the 2-year budget impasse made it difficult for children on Medicaid to get access to medical care. "I reached out to pediatricians who were saddled with hundreds of thousands of dollars in debt, including one who decided to leave the state. It's easy to get bogged down in all the numbers-736 days without a budget, \$3 billion medical bill backlog—and I wanted to shine a light on the human impact of Illinois lawmakers' inability to pass a budget."

Brian Moline won second place in the Best Series or Documentary category for his piece "St. Joseph Woman Shares Story of Opioid Addiction." Moline, the managing editor of IPM's news and public affairs department, as well as the host of **Morning Edition** on WILL-AM 580 and FM-90.9, said, "I would like to thank Jaime Smith for allowing me to tell her story of addiction and recovery. It's a powerful reminder that the opioid epidemic has touched people in our community from all walks of life. I'd also like to extend a special thank you to everyone at the Prairie Center (now Rosecrance) for getting me in touch with Jaime, and for allowing me to talk to them about their treatment process and the increasing need for additional beds."





Kimberlie Kranich won first place in the Best Series or Documentary category for her radio documentary "Still Here: Vietnam War Stories from Illinois," created with Chicago-based co-producer John Fecile. "It's incredibly satisfying to be able to work at Illinois Public Media and create stories that are inspired by community needs. I am a public servant and am always thinking about how my work can be of use to the different communities WILL serves." said Kranich, director of community content and engagement at Illinois Public Media. "I'm proud that this documentary could bring very different personal accounts of the war to the table. For this documentary to have won this award is just icing on the cake."

Documentary wins esteemed journalism award

For the first time in several years, IPM was honored with a Regional Murrow Award. Kimberlie Kranich and John Fecile's Vietnam War documentary, "Still Here: Vietnam War Stories from Illinois" won in the documentary category.

The Murrows, facilitated by the Radio Television Digital News Association, are among the most prestigious and celebrated awards for broadcast and online journalism. This first-place prize automatically nominates the documentary for a national Murrow award, held in June.

In response to the win, Kranich said, "Being an Edward R. Murrow Award Winner is an honor and a testament to grounding WILL's work in community needs. Our documentary, "Still Here: Vietnam War Stories from Illinois" is the fourth part of a four-year effort. When Ken Burns and Lynn Novick announced that their groundbreaking series, The Vietnam War, would air in 2017, WILL started to reach out to veterans, war resisters, and refugees living in central Illinois to preserve their oral histories. We involved students from Stretch Ledford's MultiMedia Reporting Class at Illinois in this process. That was part one. Part two was hiring Mark Foley, Urbana High School social studies teacher, to turn

those oral histories into media-rich lesson plans for high school teachers and distribute them for free on PBSLearningMedia. org. Part three was to hire my co-producer, John Fecile, to take a small subset of these oral histories and turn them into a comprehensive and compelling story about the harsh realities of war as well as journeys of survival and recovery. And part four was to host screenings at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum of these local stories with the public at interactive sessions. Each part contributes to a much larger whole.

I am grateful that our contributors trusted us to tell and share their stories with the public."



Lee Gaines Potential Pitfalls of Poverty Simulations

"I covered a poverty simulation used for professional development training to help teachers and support staff better grasp the realities faced by children and families surviving on low incomes. I left with a lot of questions. I then found research that suggested these simulations could potentially reinforce negative stereotypes about people living in poverty. I also found a woman who facilitated and participated in the simulation in Springfield schools who could speak to the value of the simulation (it helped her contextualize her own experience living in poverty) and the pitfalls (she told me she saw the false assumptions of other educators who had never experienced the real thing reinforced)."

Christine Herman How to Treat Chronic Pain without Opioids

"The idea for this story originated from an email I received last year from a listener after I produced a week-long series on the opioid crisis in Illinois for The 21st show. The email was from a psychologist at a pain clinic in Peoria, who wanted to draw my attention to the fact that the way we treat chronic pain with opioids is all wrong. I did some digging, reached out to national pain experts and learned that, in fact, the research shows the best treatment for chronic pain is not a drug, but rather hands-on approach that incorporates physical and psychological therapies with lifestyle changes. But there are many challenges and barriers when it comes to accessing this kind of treatment."


