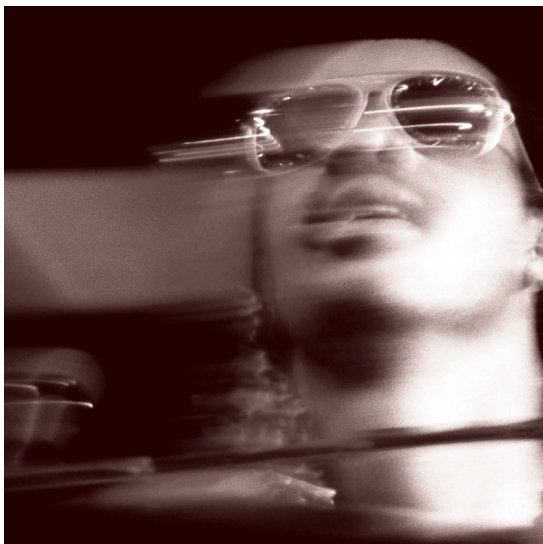
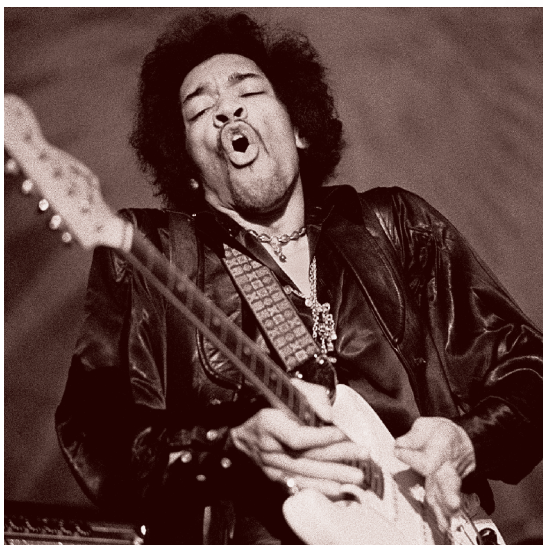
As part of its commitment to support and present diverse content created by a broad array of storytellers, PBS presents **The Latino Experience**, a new three-part anthology series of short fiction and nonfiction films. The new series airs at 8 pm Tuesdays, July 6-20. Featuring 13 original films made by filmmakers working across genres, the shorts explore a wide range of experiences, perspectives and styles to highlight the rich diversity of the Latino/a/x community across the United States and Puerto Rico. From dramas to documentaries, comedies to magical realism, **The Latino Experience** showcases an exciting lineup of creative talent, both in front of and behind the camera.

"We are excited to highlight and share **The Latino Experience**, a compilation of shorts that showcase the wide-ranging talent, diversity and complexity within the Latinx community in the US and abroad," said Wendy Llinas, Senior Director, Programming & Development, PBS. "These narrative and scripted shorts reflect the joy, creativity, courage, humor, pain and resilience in our communities with top-notch authentic storytelling that reflects the many lived experiences of Latinos/as/x at this moment in history."

Films included in **The Latino Experience** were selected from entries received by PBS following a call for submissions in August 2020. Chosen by a panel of experienced filmmakers, the shorts received funding support as well as a national broadcast as part of the series.

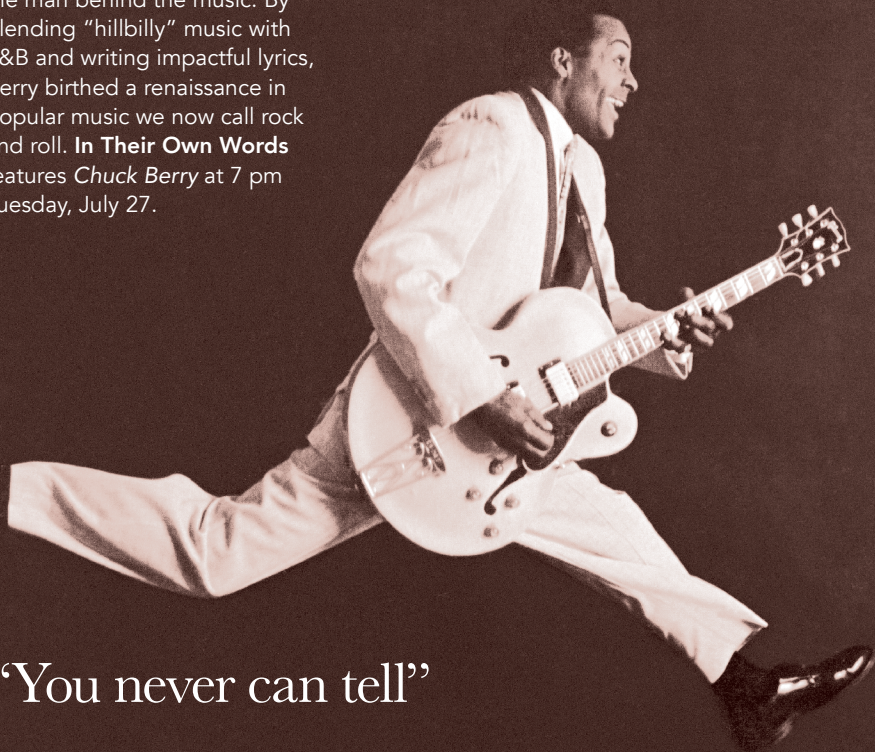
Featuring irreverent interviews with some of the most famous music photographers, musicians, gallerists, music journalists and social commentators, **Icon: Music Through The Lens** is an eye-opening thrill ride that captures what it was like on both sides of the camera when the most recognizable images in history were taken. Via studio portraits, record sleeves, coffee table books, along with magazine photo shoots, fine art, and images taken at live shows and exhibitions, viewers will learn about the origins of these enduring, iconic images and the future of music photography.

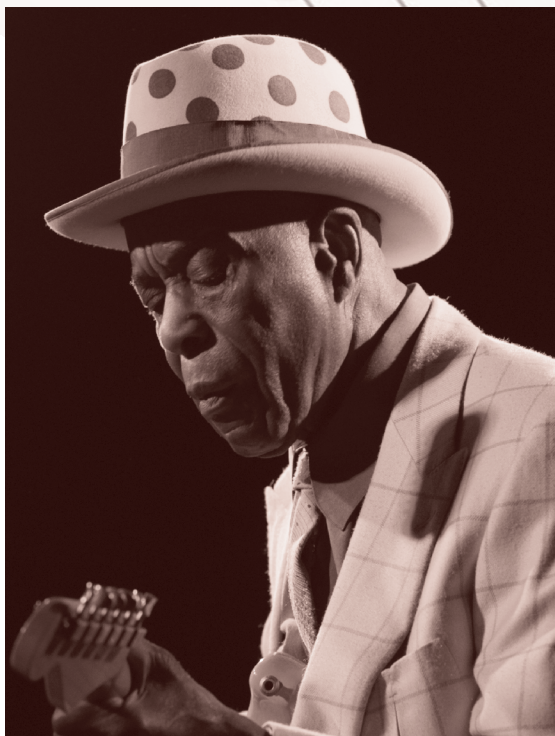

Illinois Public Media wins three journalism awards



EDWARD R. MURROW AWARDS — 2021 —

Illinois Public Media has won three Regional Edward R. Murrow Awards for Illinois Newsroom's coverage of the COVID-19 pandemic and overall coverage of Illinois people and issues.

"We're thrilled to be honored with three Regional Edward R. Murrow awards this year—widely considered the most prestigious awards given in local journalism," said Moss Bresnahan, executive director of Illinois Public Media. "It is a testament to how our team stepped up its commitment to trusted local journalism in 2020, in a time when other newsrooms were shrinking in the face of a pandemic and budget cuts."

The Radio Television Digital News Association (RTDNA) has honored Illinois Public Media with awards for excellence in "Continuing Coverage" of the University of Illinois COVID-19 testing program; in "Digital" for both the website and multimedia approach to reporting; and in "Hard News" for an in-depth feature story on one family's struggles with food insecurity during a pandemic.

"This is a proud moment for the news team at Illinois Public Media," said Reginald Hardwick, news and public affairs director at Illinois Public Media. "Our mission is to inform and engage people in Illinois through high-quality journalism. Our reporters focused on the personal stories of the pandemic as well as the mounting statistics."

Illinois Newsroom Agricultural Reporter Dana Cronin reported on the growing food insecurity issues across Illinois in partnership with Harvest Public Media. "No Wiggle Room" featured a mother struggling with to feed her family due

to the pandemic-induced economic recession. The story aired nationally on NPR during a Weekend **All Things Considered** program focused on food insecurity issues around America.

Also related to the newsroom's ongoing coronavirus coverage, Illinois Newsroom Health Reporter Christine Herman and former Illinois Newsroom Education Reporter Lee V. Gaines tracked the University of Illinois COVID-19 saliva testing program, from creation to roll out to possible FDA authorization for emergency use. Some of these reports were heard nationally on NPR.

IllinoisNewsroom.org was also recognized for excellence in digital news.

“Central Illinoisans counted on our Illinois-Newsroom.org to share important information on everything from in-depth interviews with congressional candidates to why farm equipment is problematic for women farmers,” said Hardwick.

On January 24, 2020, Illinois became the second state in the country with a diagnosed case of COVID-19. The Illinois Newsroom site immediately began a digital information center with updated resources and personal stories about the sacrifices made by families, parents, and migrant workers to guard against the pandemic.

As the country grappled with racial injustice, IllinoisNewsroom.org served as a forum for discussions on race and justice, including a panel discussion with local mayors, law enforcement, and Black Lives Matter activists about the role of policing. And in the ramp-up to the 2020 Election, the site hosted an ambitious Voter’s Guide that included videos of local county clerks answering Frequently Asked Questions about mail-in-voting information, in-depth interviews with candidates in the two congressional districts, and embedded real-time results on Election Day.

“Every day, our teams work their hardest to arm Central Illinois with trustworthy news. It’s also extraordinary that our teams reported mostly from home and occasionally in the field without contracting COVID-19,” Hardwick continued.

Illinois Newsroom is powered by Illinois Public Media/WILL and provides news about Illinois as well as in-depth reporting on agriculture, education, the environment, health, and politics.

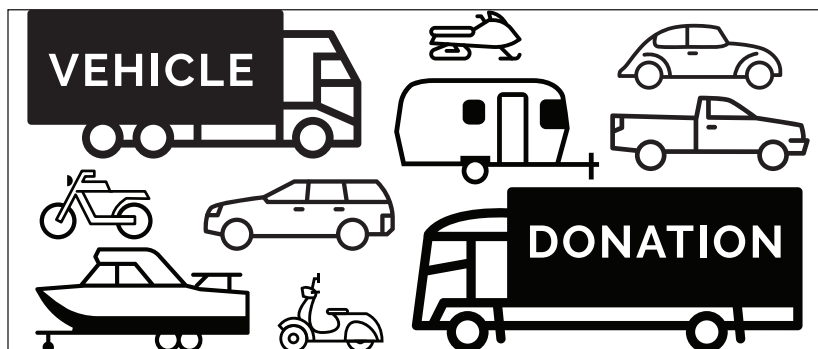

Vehicle donations at Illinois Public Media

We frequently are asked about how our vehicle donation program and what impact it has on the station. Since January 1, 2019, Illinois Public Media has raised more than \$100,000 from generous viewers and listeners via vehicle donations. Thank you to everyone who has participated—you have made a big impact on our services.

We have partnered with the CARS charitable organization to make the process as easy and beneficial as possible. If you are interested in donating a car, but are unsure how to do it, here's how the process works:

Call 855-845-1960 or submit the online vehicle donation form at will.illinois.edu/cardonation. Representatives are available seven days a week to answer your inquiries. And if you submit the online vehicle donation

form, you will be contacted within 48 hours to complete the donation and confirm your pick-up information. You will need your VIN, mileage, and general condition of the vehicle.

Schedule Your Free Pick-up. In most cases, your vehicle pick-up can be scheduled within three business days once the donation record has been completed. Be sure to remove your license plates!

Receive a Donation Receipt. Vehicle donations are tax-deductible and you will get your receipt from our charitable partner—CARS. An initial donation receipt is provided at the time of the pick-up. If the vehicle sells for \$500 or less, donors are also mailed a thank-you letter/tax receipt within 30 days of the sale of the vehicle. If the vehicle sells for more than \$500, an IRS Form 1098-C will be mailed to the donor within 30 days of the sale stating the amount of gross proceeds (the maximum amount of your tax deduction).

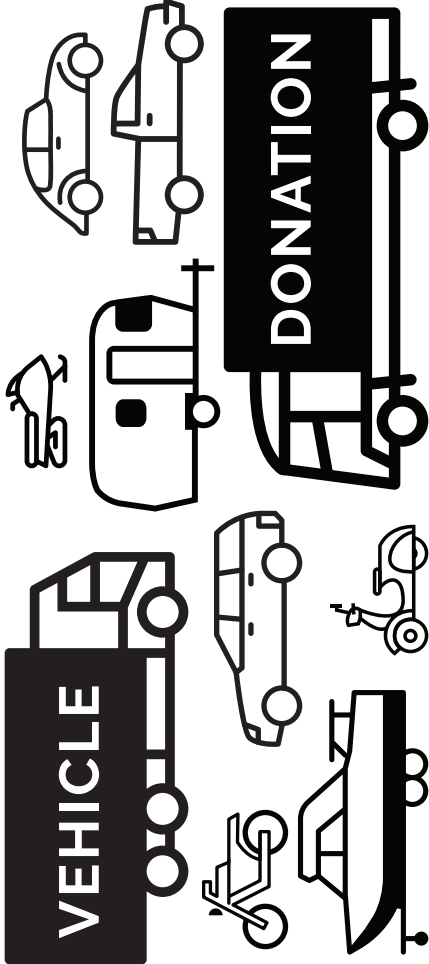
