


And finally, check out our latest additions to the primetime television schedule on pages 2-3. New British comedies and a detective series join the lineup in March.




Old and new series make a great March




barns in Illinois along with interviews with their owners and restorers.




Here comes the sun



Who:

They have years of experience growing in zone 5, and that includes dealing with all of its little quirks from wacky weather to annoying pests. This podcast will give us the opportunity to hear from local growers just like our listeners, and to even go beyond the gardening process to canning, flower arranging, and more."

What:

I find it is easy to communicate with diverse groups of people. There is always some commonality to be found.

"I really believe that bringing communities together is the only way to create large-scale change. I am really glad that Illinois Newsroom is doing that for the community outside Chicago, so that their voices have the same volume as Chicago, and people outside of Illinois will start understanding that the statewide issues affect the entire state."

This community involvment is a growing trend in public media. "My end goal is for people to hear stories and be inspired to make change in their communities. I want to go after the unheard stories deeply with the power of the station partnerships so they reach the entire state."

Walters is thrilled to be a part of the process. "I have loved public media my whole life, and I've been blown away by both the kindness and the talent of the people working here. The leadership and journalists are just top-notch. It's a great environment to work in every day."
