Back to Newport

Peter, Paul and Mary at Newport 1963-65 at 7 pm Sunday, November 25 captures the spirit of America's Folk Renaissance at its zenith, when folk music dominated the Top 40 charts and songs written straight from the hearts of idealists, activists, and poets provided the soundtrack for enormous, unprecedented changes in the American social-political landscape.

The program presents songs filmed during the emergence of the group as the most honored folk trio in history, and includes 17 never-before-seen, archival Newport performances.





The hills are alive

Beloved by generations of audiences worldwide, The Sound of Music tells the inspiring true story of the von Trapp Family Singers and their escape from Austria during the rise of Nazism. Rodgers and Hammerstein's 1959 hit stage musical garnered five Tony Awards, including Best Musical, and the blockbuster 1965 movie adaptation won five Oscars. Great Performances presents the 2015 live UK broadcast version at 8 pm Friday, November 9 starring Kara Tointon as Maria, Julian Ovenden as Captain von Trapp, Katherine Kelley as Baroness Schraeder, Alexander Armstrong as Max, and Maria Friedman as the Mother Abbess. Cinematically photographed on adjoining sound stages, the production offers a more naturalistic interpretation of this great classic of the American musical theater. Among the many classic songs featured in the score are "The Sound of Music," "My Favorite Things," "Do-Re-Mi," "Climb Every Mountain," "Edelweiss," and more.




Local series brings history home

A Golden Cross to Bear: A History of the 33rd Division in World War 1 follows Roger Amm, grandson of Pontiac, Illinois, farmer Gustave Amm, who served in the 131st Infantry Regiment, as he embarks on a global journey to honor his grandfather and all those Americans who played an important role in helping bring World War I to an end. It becomes more than just a journey of discovery as Roger explores a previously untold story of the front line experience in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, where more than 47 days of fighting led to more than 26,000 casualties, many from Illinois. Roger discovers how the events his grandfather participated in ultimately shaped the global map, Illinois, and his own family. This series from WTVP in Peoria airs at 7:30 pm Fridays in November.
