The program presents songs filmed during the emergence of the group as the most honored folk trio in history, and includes 17 never-before-seen, archival Newport performances.

Beloved by generations of audiences worldwide, ***The Sound of Music*** tells the inspiring true story of the von Trapp Family Singers and their escape from Austria during the rise of Nazism. Rodgers and Hammerstein's 1959 hit stage musical garnered five Tony Awards, including Best Musical, and the blockbuster 1965 movie adaptation won five Oscars. **Great Performances** presents the 2015 live UK broadcast version at 8 pm Friday, November 9 starring Kara Tointon as Maria, Julian Ovenden as Captain von Trapp, Katherine Kelley as Baroness Schraeder, Alexander Armstrong as Max, and Maria Friedman as the Mother Abbess. Cinematically photographed on adjoining sound stages, the production offers a more naturalistic interpretation of this great classic of the American musical theater. Among the many classic songs featured in the score are "The Sound of Music," "My Favorite Things," "Do-Re-Mi," "Climb Every Mountain," "Edelweiss," and more.

Roger discovers how the events his grandfather participated in ultimately shaped the global map, Illinois, and his own family. This series from WTVP in Peoria airs at 7:30 pm Fridays in November.
