This year, the July 4th holiday resonates more deeply with many as our country marks its 250th birthday. PBS has been building toward this milestone through its America @ 250 theme with programs that give us a chance to celebrate, remember, and reflect on the stories (and people) that shaped our country. Moments like this remind me why local public media matters. It gives us a shared place to learn, celebrate, ask questions, and better understand one another. That is true as we celebrate this important national milestone, and it is true every day in IPM's work for central Illinois.

At press time, we are nearing our end-of-fiscal-year goal of raising \$4 million in member support. In the context of the loss of federal funding, that level of progress feels especially encouraging and speaks to a community that has been stepping forward in support of trusted public media. COUNTY FAIR

Local doc focuses on the people, traditions of the county fair

County fairs are a staple of Illinois summers. The Champaign County Fair in Urbana returns this month boasting more than 170 years of history. In honor of county fairs everywhere, WILL-TV will rebroadcast the local documentary **County Fair** at 7 pm Thursday, July 23. The 2022 film from Illinois Public Media traces the history, culture, and importance of this summer tradition with stories from central Illinois.

"Visitors to the fair rarely think about the people who put so much of themselves into the event," said Sarah Edwards, producer and director of **County Fair**. "For that reason, our film focuses on the people and their love for what they do and its importance in their lives. I hope **County Fair** documents the warm and wonderful aspects of what the fair is and what it represents."

County Fair follows a seamstress, a demolition derby driver, a circus performer, two sisters who show cows, and a French fry vendor from the 2021 Champaign County Fair. The film offers footage of fairs from yesteryear and highlights funny ads and stories from fairs in the 1900s. **County Fair** was created by Edwards along with producer and editor DJ Roach, and cinematographer Isaac Musgrave. Taylor Plantan is the production assistant; Lillie Duncanson is executive producer.

The human faces of space exploration

This month, we continue to feature programs that delve into space and the people that probe our vast universe. Enjoy our space-focused lineup this month, including many notable repeats.

Once Upon a Time in Space is a landmark four-part documentary that chronicles the history of space exploration from the Cold War race and the Space Shuttle era to the modern International Space Station and lunar missions. At the dawn of a new space race, the personal stories of those who led us here offer a new and deeply human perspective on our changing world — and where we are headed. Airing Tuesdays at 8 pm beginning July 14, each episode of **Once Upon a Time in Space** will be rebroadcast Wednesdays at 9 pm.



In addition, we premiere a powerful new documentary that explores the remarkable life and legacy of Christa McAuliffe, an American teacher and astronaut from Concord, New Hampshire, who inspired generations with her enthusiasm for learning as America's first teacher in space. Through interviews with former students, New Hampshire dignitaries, and educators, she is remembered as a teacher who believed that "ordinary people can achieve extraordinary things." **Christa** airs at 10:30 pm Tuesday, July 7.

Among our encore presentations: space-themed **NOVA** episodes air Wednesdays at 8 pm beginning July 8, as well as a rebroadcast of the five-part **NOVA: Universe Revealed** Wednesdays at 10 pm beginning July 15. **American Experience: Chasing the Moon** (3 parts) airs Fridays at 8 pm beginning July 24, and **8 Days: To the Moon and Back** (9 pm Tuesday, July 7) and **Space Explorers: Moonrise on the ISS** (9 pm Tuesday, July 14) also are rebroadcast.



CELEBRATING 250 YEARS OF FREEDOM

This month marks the semiquincentennial of the Declaration of Independence. Enjoy these radio and television programs and others this month to learn about the people and events that make us uniquely American.

A celebration from where it all started

In partnership with The American Revolution 250 Commission, PBS presents **America — Made In Virginia: 250 Years Together**, a new special commemorating America's independence. The special will broadcast live from Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area at 7 pm Saturday, July 4 (and be rebroadcast at 9 pm). In honor of our nation's semiquincentennial, the two-hour special celebrates the ideas, people, and defining moments that gave rise to the United States of America. The program blends live performance, music, historic interpretation, and large-scale visual spectacle to create an inspiring national event. Rooted in Virginia's central role in the nation's founding — from Jamestown to Williamsburg to Yorktown — the event underscores the enduring impact of the Commonwealth in shaping the United States. Designed as both a celebration and a unifying national moment, the broadcast invites audiences to reflect on the past, engage in the present, and see themselves reflected in America's continuing story.

'A Capitol Fourth' tradition continues

Join us in celebrating on the eve of our nation's 250th birthday with **Capitol Fourth: 250th Weekend Celebration** at 7 and 8:30 pm Friday, July 3. The annual event features well-known musical artists and fireworks that light up the D.C. skyline. This year, the event features the National Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of premier pops conductor Jack Everly, alongside country music icon Trace Adkins, who gives an exclusive television debut of his new anthem, "American Made." Top stars from pop, country, R&B, classical, and Broadway are featured. Alfonso Ribeiro hosts.

Chasing the American dream

As the United States celebrates its 250th anniversary, **Amerigo: The Search for the American Dream** asks "what happened to the American Dream?" and explores if it is still attainable for many today. Filmed across all 50 states over two years, the program features unscripted interviews by David McCourt with everyday Americans, from blue-collar workers, veterans, and immigrants to students, entrepreneurs, and community leaders. Told in thematic chapters examining work, housing, healthcare, technology, art, and more, **Amerigo: The Search for the American Dream** captures a raw, panoramic and unexpectedly hopeful portrait of a country at a crossroads. The film airs at 12:30 pm Sunday, July 5.

On July 4, you can watch (or re-watch) Ken Burns' **The American Revolution** — 1 am to 5 am (episodes 1–2) and 11 am to 7 pm (episodes 3–6) — as well as go behind-the-scenes in **American Revolution: An Inside Look** (12:30 am). **Antiques Roadshow** (Mondays at 7 and 8 pm) and **Finding Your Roots** (Tuesdays at 7 pm) each have several episodes this month tying in to PBS' America @ 250 theme.

‘American Experience’ follows JFK’s rise to power

Forever enshrined in myth by an assassin’s bullet, John F. Kennedy’s presidency long defied objective appraisal.

American Experience: JFK follows Kennedy’s rise to power from his birth to his election as president in 1960, the youngest man ever to be elected to the office. The two-part program also includes a look at his time at the White House, his assassination, and the unfulfilled promise

of his presidency. The special provides illuminating interviews from family members, historians, and authors, offering insight into Kennedy’s early years, from his transformation from a sickly youth to Washington’s most eligible bachelor to the nation’s president. It also offers fresh assessments of the successes and failures of his tenure. **American Experience: JFK** airs at 8 pm Friday, July 10 and July 17. On July 10, it is followed by **JFK: Breaking the News** at 10 pm, which offers a close-up look at how reporters responded to the national tragedy of JFK’s assassination.



A sweeping musical journey

From spirituals and hymns to Broadway and contemporary classics, **America in Song: A Concordia Celebration** explores the melodies that have shaped the nation’s story. Filmed from California to New York, this sweeping musical event from Concordia University Irvine reflects on liberty, hope, struggle, and unity through the power of song. **America in Song: A Concordia Celebration** airs at 11 pm Saturday, July 4 and at 4 pm Sunday, July 5.

National experts discuss America’s future

Live from the LBJ Library with Mark Updegrove features LBJ Foundation CEO, author, and historian Mark Updegrove, who interviews preeminent thought leaders — historians, authors, journalists, filmmakers, and others — about issues vital to America’s future, including the state of our democracy and the importance of strong leadership. **Live from the LBJ Library with Mark Updegrove** airs Sundays at 10 am with season 3 premiering July 5.

Area residents reflect on America @ 250

As Americans celebrate the 250th anniversary of our independence, Illinois Public Media is marking the occasion with a new audio series that explores views of local community members.

America @ 250: The Questions Before Us, produced in partnership with the Illinois Student Newsroom, elevates the voices of east-central Illinois residents as they reflect on the nation’s 250th birthday and the big questions facing us, as Americans, at this moment in our history. The new series launches Monday, June 29, with new stories rolling out every Monday on **Morning Edition** and published at ipmnewsroom.org/america250.

The project was conceived by journalism professor Charles “Stretch” Ledford, who co-leads the Illinois Student Newsroom at Illinois Public Media with IPM News editor Christine Herman.

“Birthdays, anniversaries and the like are milestones. They naturally invite reflection,” Ledford said. “So we’re asking people to consider the nation’s 250th birthday and think about where we stand as a country at this historical juncture. In a nutshell, we’re asking folks to share what they think is the most important question facing us as Americans at this particular moment in time, and why?”

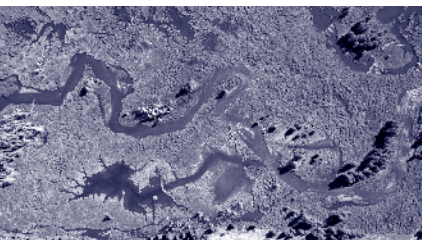
Wild stories of the Southwest

Two films this month airing on Wednesday, July 8, highlight the great Southwest — its ecological impact and its importance as a natural resource.

The American Southwest (9 pm) takes viewers on an unforgettable journey down the mighty Colorado River. Narrated by Indigenous activist Quannah Chasinghorse, the film beautifully showcases the region's abundant wildlife, confronts the ecological impacts of dams and water overuse, and advocates for better management of the river.

If reached, the result would be total system failure, and agriculture in the desert valleys of Southern California would cease to exist.

Her new role came about because of her love of animals. In a newly created position, she will serve as the foster care coordinator at the Champaign County Humane Society. The new foster program will differ from the shelter's current medical foster program and be geared toward enrichment for animals while they're at the shelter, as well as explore opportunities for animals to spend more time outside of the shelter, such as Doggie Day Out or even foster-to-adopt. It will include a lot of collaboration between all of the departments and the volunteers and fosters at the humane society while the program gets on its feet, she said.

She also is an actor and singer who frequently appears in local productions, saying she feels most at home on stage. 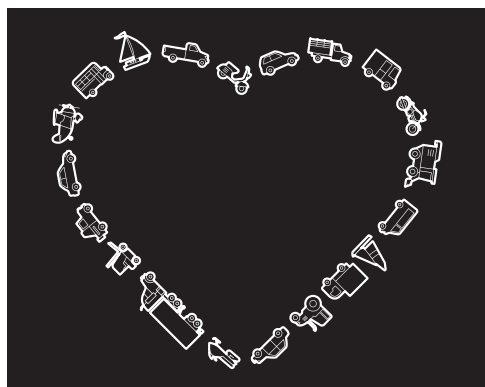
